

Climate Movements We Supported



SAVE NICOBAR

The #SaveNicobar campaign was launched in response to a potential mega-infrastructure project on the island. It threatened swaths of forest land, as well as the lives and the livelihood of the Shompen and Nicobarese tribes.



#SAVE NICOBAR POSTCARDS CAMPAIGN

The #SaveNicobar Postcards Campaign was launched in collaboration with the Rotaract Club of USME in November 2023. It aimed to help concerned citizens and organisations raise awareness about the environmental and human rights concerns on the Great Nicobar Island.

The postcards asked the authorities to reevaluate the environmental clearances given for the 'Holistic Development of Great Nicobar Island Project' and to scrap the project given it is an ecologically sensitive island.

The postcard campaign garnered support from youth groups across India. We also created and distributed a guide for the volunteers. **1,200 signed postcards** were gathered to be sent to relevant authorities.



#SAVE NICOBAR POSTCARDS CAMPAIGN: PAN-INDIA PARTICIPATION



Each collaborator educated more people on this issue and documented the process of getting the postcards signed. So far, we have received over 1,200 postcards signed by people from various states & UTs of India, supporting the cause and urging the authorities to safeguard the Great Nicobar Island.

True to TINEB's efforts to decentralize its campaigns, our Onboarding Deck for the postcards campaign enabled several climate movements to mobilize people on the need for protecting Nicobar's native indigenous people and trees.

FOREST CONSERVATION AMENDMENT ACT

There Is No Earth B, Fridays for Future India, and Climate Front India worked to bring attention to the Forest Conservation Amendment Act 2023 that was passed during the Parliament's Monsoon Session. This act was undemocratically rushed through Parliament, with over **1200 notes** being dismissed during the public consultation period and a lack of procedure in its referral to the Joint Parliamentary Committee. By excluding land recognized as forests before 1980 unless officially notified, the act reduced protections and facilitated the commercial exploitation of India's forests. Despite its passage, there was significant opposition, including from a Member of Parliament from West Bengal.

Messages were sent to Members of Parliament via TINEB's "WhatsApp Your MP" initiative, with a call to withdraw the FCA 2023 Act, on 30 July 2023.

In response, TINEB launched the #SaveIndianForests campaign and an email petition to the Ministry of Environment, Forests, and Climate Change calling to withdraw the act. We also started the "WhatsAppYourMP" initiative

to encourage supporters to engage directly with their elected representatives. TINEB's tech team quickly set up a website that made it easy for people to send pre-written messages to Rajya Sabha members with just one click. Our posts on social media highlighted its potential harm to biodiversity and indigenous communities. In February 2024, the Supreme Court issued an interim order reaffirming the broader definition ensuring conservation for all forested areas.

Respected Sir,

I am writing to bring to your Notice that the proposed revisions to the Forest (Conservation) Act, of 1980, are worrisome and will have significant implications for our environment and biodiversity.

The Forest (Conservation) Amendment Bill's modifications, exempting certain forest lands from protection, could lead to the loss of vital wildlife habitats and ecological services, leaving 15% of Indian forests ready to be exploited.

Furthermore, the wide-ranging exclusions for building projects on forest land, including zoos and tourist attractions, will disturb wildlife and natural ecosystems to a great and concerning extent. Since there is a wide emphasis on compensatory afforestation on forest land, old-growth forests are at risk of being replaced with unsustainable monoculture plantations.

The said bill has sparked concerns over the need for clearing forests for motorways and hydropower projects. This sets a dangerous precedent, diluting the needed environmental due diligence mandated by law as it gives easy leeway to the displacement of indigenous communities, especially in the Northeast.

Northeastern states, rich in biodiversity and home to many endemic species, fear blanket impacts under the provisions of the Amendment. The bill protects only notified forests, excluding unnotified ones in the North-East, which accounts for 23.75% of the country's forest cover.

Overall It will affect Forest Cover of States Like West Bengal, Orissa Uttarkhand, Himachal Pradesh etc.

Therefore I humbly urge the Our Hon'ble Minister to look into the matter, as our environmental protection deserves top priority, in these times of Global Warming.

As an outcome of the #WhatsAppYourMP campaign, on August 3rd, a Member of Parliament addressed a letter to the Minister of Environment, voicing opposition to the proposed bill that has now been passed in both houses of the parliament.

STAND WITH SIKKIM

In October 2023, Sikkim was devastated by the catastrophic Glacial Lake Outburst Flood. It destroyed the Teesta Dam and submerged numerous areas, leaving many people missing. The aftermath of the Sikkim floods exposed the vulnerabilities in India's hydropower infrastructure.

To highlight the need to reassess dam projects in the ecologically-fragile Himalayas, several environmental groups, such as Youth for Himalaya, Climate Front India, and Youth for Climate India took to social media with hashtags such as #StandWithSikkim and #Don'tDamHimalayas. The cause resonated with many people online.

Our efforts were designed to facilitate solidarity with the people of Sikkim and raise awareness about the urgent need for improved infrastructure and support.

SAVE PULICAT

In September 2023, we collaborated with multiple youth groups, including the Chennai Climate Action Group, Palluyir Trust, Fridays for Future India, Let India Breathe, and Climate Front India, to support the fisherfolk community in Chennai, which would be affected by the proposed port project in Pulicat. The campaign, under the hashtag #StopAdaniSaveChennai, opposed the Adani project in the Ennore-Pulicat region. Experts have warned that the project could lead to increased coastal erosion, groundwater depletion, and flooding in the area.

TINEB supported the campaign by participating in the Twitter storm and curating the Twitter deck for the Save Pulicat Campaign. The Twitter storm for the fisherfolk community of Pulicat, Chennai trended at #6 nationwide, and we generated an Advertising Value Equivalent (AVE) INR 36,88,058.

SAVE SANJAY VAN

On 17th March 2024, volunteers from There Is No Earth B discovered that 800 to 1,000 trees in Sanjay Van had been felled, creating a large clearing within the forest. Although the authorities planted saplings on the same land, it was unclear who would care for these saplings and ensure their survival.



Massive tree felling in Sanjay Van:
Nearly 800-1000 *Prosopis Juliflora* trees were chopped down this March, raising concerns over the vanishing green cover in the area.



New saplings were planted, but a recent recce by teammates this financial year (2024-25) revealed that most have dried.

We reported our findings to the media, and on March 21, the Office of the Deputy Conservator of Forests [issued a notice to the authorities](#), deeming the tree felling in Sanjay Van illegal. The notice stated that the authorities had violated the Delhi Preservation of Trees Act 1994 by felling trees without permission and summoned them to appear before the Tree Office on April 17. As of August 2024, there is no information available online or from official sources stating whether this meeting occurred or what measures have been taken since. TINEB has been advocating for the [protection of Sanjay Van](#) since 2021 and has over 2,700 signatures supporting our campaign.

In event of failure to appear, legal action will be initiated against concerned and the matter would be proceeded ex-parte. *As per section 136, CrPC, non-compliance of this notice will attract penal provisions u/s 188 of IPC.*

Campaign Victory!



The 'Save Ridge Forest' Campaign was launched in 2020 to protect the Central Ridge Forest located near Karol Bagh, New Delhi.

Our campaign advocated for the construction of a proper boundary wall around the forest to prevent people from dumping non-biodegradable waste, as a breach in the wall provided easy access inside the forest. There Is No Earth B sent multiple letters to the authorities to raise our concerns on the same.


22 APRIL, 2022

We submitted a complaint letter to the Central Pollution Control Board regarding illegal waste dumping, burning, defecation, and logging in the Central Ridge Forest. Meanwhile, we motivated 112 citizens to send email petitions to the Chief Conservator of Forests, the Conservator of Forests, and the Deputy Conservator of Forests, urging them to take action and rebuild the wall.

MAY 2023

The Forest and Wildlife Department finalised plans to redesign the Delhi Ridge's boundary wall after discovering breaches that had allowed easy access for waste dumping in the Capital's ridge areas.

The success of the campaign was made possible by the unwavering dedication of our team, collaboration between the research, creators, and tech teams, and the invaluable support from people who actively engaged by sending emails to authorities and standing with us.

Respected Sir:

We, being a non-profit organization environmental advocacy group by name 'No Earth B' appeal to you to take necessary action to stop illegal waste dumping, burning, defecation and logging in the Central Ridge Forest, Karol Bagh. Additionally, there is a breach in the Ridge wall that provides easy access inside the forest, causing deforestation at a faster pace.

The Central Ridge Forest, a 450-hectare green lung situated in a major open space in Delhi, that serves the effects of pollution, ecological degradation, and provides a natural green belt to the city. This area is rich in biodiversity and is important for the growing population of Delhi.

Established around 1800, the forest area and its surroundings in the northern subregion, 35+ native villages, 10+ tribal villages, 10+ religious sites, 10+ ancient temples, 10+ ancient water bodies, 10+ ancient trees, 10+ ancient shrines, 10+ ancient wells, 10+ ancient groves, and 10+ ancient groves, on 1000 Bighas¹.² The area of trees showed just how much more is to remove and restore the entire natural setting. Moreover, we have been writing to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) about the same issue since 2020, but no action till now has been taken.

Despite filing a complaint with the Central Pollution Control Board in April 2022, highlighting waste being burned and dumped in the open, Bhawna Tanwar, 23, a campaigner from TINEB, said no remedial action had been taken, with several portions of the wall still broken. "Until the wall is repaired, people will continue to dump waste there," she said.

2024 Youth Climate Convening



The Youth Climate Convening (YCC) 2024 was hosted from January 5-8 at the Fireflies Intercultural Center in Bangalore. Indigenous youth groups, campaigns, and organisations working towards climate justice came together to discuss a shared vision for the future as well as present solutions to tackle environmental issues in India.

The three-day event included workshops, group discussions, and showcases where representatives talked about environmental entrepreneurship, capacity building, and sustainable collective action.

TINEB spoke about our campaigning methods, which includes regular cleanup drives, digital outreach strategies, and the use of technology to mobilise climate action.

As the convening neared its completion, a session was held to prioritise actionable items to work on before the next YCC. The main objectives included forming a channel for exchanging opportunities and gigs, creating secure collectives and cultural archives, setting up Internal Complaints Committees / POSH* committees, and coordinating tech teams for capacity building.



17 Cleanup Drives

We organised clean-up drives across Indian cities such as Delhi, Bangalore, Goa, Chandigarh. Volunteers from diverse backgrounds lent a hand to clear waste from ecologically important sites including Sanjay Van, the Ridge Forest, the Yamuna River, Sukhna Lake, Hollant Beach, Sao Jacinto Island, Sankval Beach, Juhu Beach, and Ulsoor Lake.

We have contributed to the regeneration of these environmentally sensitive areas by removing over a tonne of non-biodegradable waste through community-based action.

In July 2023, There Is No Earth B hosted two workshops to convert waste into beautiful and functional items, preventing them from reaching landfills. Climate Justice 101

On October 12, 2023, Dhrstudymn facilitated an interactive discussion at Mount Carmel College, Bangalore in collaboration with its Political Science Association.

The event discussed rising urban temperatures and effective policy measures to combat climate change. The highlight of the session was an activity called '**The Privilege Walk**', where 6 volunteers from diverse socio-economic backgrounds discussed how the impact of natural disasters on their livelihoods and quality of life is disproportionate. Climate justice in the context of both developed and developing countries was discussed as well.

Participants engaged in conversations comparing the role of systemic change and individual actions in solving the climate crisis. The workshop concluded with a Q&A session, focusing on There Is No Earth B's past campaigns and helping participants understand how they can contribute to social movements.

Writing Workshop

There Is No Earth B hosted a writing and grounding workshop with Sushmita, an accomplished journalist in the climate space. Attended by 17 people, the workshop emphasised accessing deeper thoughts through inner reflection and cultivating a supportive community. It aimed at resolving creative blocks by understanding that writing is a process of embodiment.



Webinar on Chandubi Lake

There Is No Earth B organised a webinar to spread awareness on the environmental impact of sand mining in the Kulsi River and its potential effects on the Chandubi Lake ecosystem. Given the proximity to Guwahati, currently experiencing significant infrastructure development, the session highlighted the urgency of implementing immediate conservation measures.

The Kulsi River, flowing through the Assam-Meghalaya border into the Brahmaputra, has suffered from rampant illegal sand mining for over a decade. This practice disrupts the livelihoods of the local people traditionally engaged in fishing, now exploited by sand mafia syndicates. Chandubi Lake, a sanctuary for migratory birds and diverse flora, is at risk. The webinar called for increased scrutiny and swift action to preserve these vital ecosystems by implementing environmental protection policy. A research document was prepared to understand the issue in depth.

Climate Change and Gender


A webinar titled "Climate Change & Gender" was held on July 29 2023 in a collaboration between Girl Up Astitva, Miranda House and There Is No Earth B. The session was led by Dr. Budhaditya Das, Assistant Professor at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University to highlight the gendered impacts of climate change on society, polity, and the economy.

It emphasised that climate change affects women disproportionately as they are primarily involved in agriculture and domestic labour. Dr. Das condemned recent cases of sexual violence in Manipur and discussed historical examples of gendered responses to climate crises.

The case of the Sunderbans was discussed in detail, highlighting how cyclones have disrupted livelihoods and led to climate-induced migration, child marriage, trafficking of women for sex work, and intimate partner violence.

Global climate negotiations, predominantly led by men, often overlook the concerns of women and gender minorities, resulting in policies that perpetuate gender inequality.

The webinar concluded with discussions on policy solutions, the importance of a multidisciplinary approach to addressing climate change, and the need for the involvement of underrepresented communities.



TINEB IN THE NEWS



There Is No Earth B members **Dhriti** and **Anshi** were invited to an episode of the television talk show "**We The People**" The programme is broadcast every Sunday evening at 8 P.M. on NDTV 24x7. The episode aired on 3rd September and aimed to address Delhi's deteriorating air quality index (AQI) as highlighted in a report by the University of Chicago.

The show featured several prominent guests including Executive Director Parthaa Bosu, Founder Ronak Sutaria, air pollution expert Dr. Milind Kulkarni, and Dr. Vivek Nangia who is the Principal Director and Head of the Pulmonary Department at Max Hospital.

The show discussed several key factors affecting Delhi's air quality including Sanjay Van and the critical need to safeguard it. The commencement of operations for the smog towers in Connaught Place and Anand Vihar in September was also noted.

Finally, the controversial Forest Conservation Amendment Bill was discussed which seeks to limit the number of green spaces that can be classified as forests and thus do not come under protection laws.






